Hedy R, "My family and I are so happy and relieved because of the support I now receive."

Hedy, an accomplished artist, says about four years ago she became quite reclusive. She had to surrender her drivers' license, developed some medical issues, lost some of her hearing and gave up both art lessons and her involvement in the art community. When friends asked her to spend time with them or participate in an activity, Hedy would say to them, "I will see how I feel."

Since hearing about and becoming a member of Bay to Sound Neighbors last year, Hedy says she is in transition. "My family and I are so happy and relieved because of the support I now receive. "Bay to Sound Neighbors is there for me when I need to go to the market, get my hair cut or get to medical appointments. I know I am not alone and can rely and depend on the volunteers. In addition to getting transportation to the grocery store, volunteers help me with reaching for and placing grocery items in my cart and even reading the labels for me on my grocery items. Last fall, I had volunteers help with small household projects such as moving my deck furniture, large planters and hoses into the garage."

Hedy has met ten volunteers in only four months with Bay to Sound Neighbors and says that all of her experiences have been positive and wonderful. "I feel overwhelmed with gratefulness. I plan to start painting again and getting out to some art exhibits. I am out of my shell and have joined the human race again because of Bay to Sound Neighbors!"

Why Volunteer with Bay to Sound Neighbors?

Jim L - "I enjoy transporting people and having spirited conversations"

Before joining Bay to Sound Neighbors as a volunteer last year, Jim already understood that a strong need existed to provide rides for people in the community who are no longer able to drive. He had past experience driving people to medical appointments and knows first-hand how grateful people are for this alternative to taking a taxi or having to ask a neighbor. "When you are not able to drive your own car any more, it is a huge loss for people. I enjoy transporting people and having spirited conversations with them while in the car. People have such fascinating lives."

Jim acknowledges that it feels good when the people he drives give him positive feedback. "So many are lonely and they miss connecting with others. People are happy and comforted knowing that they can just pick up the phone and call Bay to Sound Neighbors for a ride to an appointment or to the grocery store. It's an enjoyable experience for both of us."

At a recent holiday get together, Jim recalls the daughter of a member he has taken to some appointments telling her mother, "This is a whole new you. You are actually getting out now. You are like your old self!" Jim says that after signing up as a volunteer with Bay to Sound Neighbors, he has a whole new appreciation for grocery shopping. "Each person brings their own intensity to how they grocery shop – and I am getting some exercise while I shop with people!"
